Topical and expository sermon series Looking at Jesus The motif of journey as appropriate to Luke Journeying as a state of mind See new things even in familiar territory There are risks (confronted with new ideas, challenged to change) There is somewhere we are trying to get to (be like Jesus)

The Prologue: 1:1-4

Seven layers of reliability

- 1. The date of writing: 62-80: not enough time for myth development
- 2. Many have undertaken: multiple sources of evidence
- 3. Among us: Luke writes as a member of the community
- 4. Eyewitnesses from the beginning (see John 1:14; 1 John 1:1-4; 2 Peter 1:16-18)
- 5. "Ministers" (official representatives, officers) of the word (Acts 8:4, 10:36)
- 6. Having followed all things closely from the first
- 7. Writing an orderly account

That you, Theophilus, may have certainty

Litmus tests for credibility Credibility of the messenger (3, 6) Credibility of the sources (2, 4, 5) Credibility of the transmission process (1, 7) There is strong reason to trust this ancient account
