

Knowing the Unknowable Love of Christ

Ephesians 3:14-21

First Request: Strength

With power through the Spirit in the inner being: v.16

You may have strength to comprehend: v.18

According to the power at work within us: v.20

Where: in the inner person: v.16,20

What: presence of Spirit (16), synonymous with presence of Christ (17)

How: rooted and grounded: v.17

Strength for What?

To comprehend what is the height, width, depth and length

To know the love of Christ (for us and the world)

What does it mean "to know"?

To encounter over and above merely conceptualizing

Semitic knowing as encounter

Paul wants to know Christ in Phil 3:10

The limits of conceptualization when stargazing

When something is too big for conceptualization, encounter provides real knowledge

This is how we "know" something that is "unknowable"

Why do we need strength to encounter the love of Christ?

Molten steel in cardboard containers

Too much gravel in the back of the pick up

The love of Christ too large, too dense, too fierce to be encountered unaided

The story of God and Moses in Exodus 33:13-23

Jesus is our Rock who has made us able to receive the fierce love of God!!

Fullness

Fullness of God: His presence, His power, His riches, His love

What happens when you put a large amount in a small container?

It (1) fills up and (2) overflows

The quest to be filled is the human quest: thirst, desire, need, drive us

The tragedy of filling up with wrong stuff is two fold: Jeremiah 2:13

Augustine: You have made us for Yourself; we are restless until we find our rest in You

God is able to effect this impossible filling: v.20

How does knowing the love **of** Christ result in Glory **to** Christ?

The overflow effect

It turns us into love-spillers!

Others are splashed with Jesus-love and are shown to turn to Him for fullness
